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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	(Time noted: 3:30 p.m.)
3	CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Ms. Reilly?
4	MS. REILLY: Good afternoon. Welcome to the
5	December 20, 2012 meeting of the Teachers' Retirement
б	Board. We'll begin by calling the roll.
7	Melvyn Aaronson?
8	CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Here.
9	MS. REILLY: Kathleen Grimm?
10	(No response.)
11	Not here.
12	MS. REILLY: Sandra March?
13	MS. MARCH: Present.
14	MS. REILLY: Thad McTigue?
15	MR. McTIGUE: Here.
16	MS. REILLY: Frieda Foster?
17	(No response.)
18	MS. REILLY: Mona Romain?
19	MS. ROMAIN: Here.
20	MS. REILLY: Carolyn Wolpert?
21	MS. WOLPERT: Here.
22	MS. REILLY: We have a quorum.
23	Next on the agenda is an update from TRS on
24	operations. I will give a quick update.
25	We're closing down the Manhasset trailer

where our staff has been residing and processing
 benefits, and we're moving that staff to the Long Island
 City office. We've gotten all the computers moved over
 there, and as of tomorrow all staff will be working out
 of the Long Island City office.

б We have the IT Department over at 55 Water 7 Street, and we've gotten what's called an 8 uninterruptible power supply, which is attached to the 9 computers, which protects it from power surges. It's a 10 huge piece of equipment that was delivered, attached, so 11 we were able to bring our computer systems back up, 12 which allowed us to check the phone systems. And we do 13 have internal and external call capability.

14 So we're looking at our other systems to see 15 if there was any damage or disruption to those.

16 IT should be finishing its assessment by 17 early next week, and we still have a problem where we 18 don't have access to our computer system which is 19 located at a company named Savage, which is external. 20 That's where we run our web out of and our production 21 system.

So we're looking at a plan to bring all of the operations back to 55 Water Street, and figure out a way, because the web is running out of Savage, to connect the web computer system to our systems at 55 Water. Once we're able to do that, we can bring staff
 back in.

3 We're going to turn one training room into a 4 call center, because the second floor is still not available for a call center. So we're going to turn 5 that room into a call center. We'll take one of our б 7 meeting rooms and make a mail room out of that, and a 8 document imaging department. 9 So we're really --10 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: What about a walk-in 11 center? 12 MS. REILLY: The walk-in center, we'll just 13 have to continue at BERS until the second floor is 14 available. 15 So we're pushing for the first or second 16 week of January to start to move staff back in. We're 17 going to do that in an orderly way, and we have a plan 18 to bring people back. 19 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Has part of the 20 building been checked for health matters and so forth? 21 MS. REILLY: Right. We did have a company come in and they performed a test for mold for us, the 22 air quality and mold. We actually had that test 23 confirmed by the UFT, an environmental hygienist, so 24 25 thank you for that.

And the hygienist from UFT reviewed the 1 2 reports and told us it was safe to go back into the 3 building from an air quality perspective. 4 We are looking to get a cleaning service to 5 come back in. б To be honest, we went to the building and 7 there are areas of the building that sometimes you do 8 smell the fuel from the generators that surround the 9 building. But we are being told the air quality is 10 good, and we're going to have the area cleaned so when 11 people come back, hopefully they'll be comfortable. 12 MS. ROMAIN: Are there tenants in the 13 building? 14 MS. REILLY: There are tenants in the building. The Department of Transportation moved back 15 16 in. I don't believe they have phone systems, but 17 they're working themselves in hot spots that they set 18 up. 19 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: They could bring 20 their bikes in and generate enough electricity. 21 (Laughter.) MS. REILLY: I believe Emblem Health has two 22 23 thousand people in the building, and they're starting to bring people back in, a hundred people per day. I 24 believe they're talking about late January or February 25

1 they will come back.

2 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: And is DC coming 3 back? 4 MS. REILLY: I heard they're not coming back at all, but I don't know if that's true. 5 б MR. KATZ: They're planning to move to 7 Jersey in the summertime. They got space in Jersey 8 City. They'll move entirely out. I don't know when 9 they're coming back. 10 MS. REILLY: I think we see light at the end 11 of the tunnel. People are tired and want a home. We're 12 excited that we're starting to see some progress. 13 That's it. 14 (Ms. Van Eysden entered the meeting.) 15 MS. REILLY: The RMD checks and EFTs are 16 being processed and going out. 17 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: All retirement checks 18 have been going out? 19 MS. REILLY: Yes. 20 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Mailed the EFT. 21 MS. REILLY: Putting people on payroll. CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: How about medical 22 23 retirement, disability retirement? 24 MS. REILLY: Robert was working on -- and doctors did come in. 25

1 MR. GILLER: Yes. Using NYCERS for 2 examinations. 3 MS. ROMAIN: Did you get a lot of switches 4 from paper to EFT? 5 MS. REILLY: We get a lot of switches to б EFT. 7 MS. MARCH: When we're back in the building 8 and do our first benefits report, it should be a front 9 cover story. Maybe even with a reproduction of the EFT card on the face of that issue. And just make it as 10 11 easy as possible for them. 12 If you can do it to everybody -- because the 13 story really could say for the benefit of those of you 14 who have the EFT. And so I really think that should be 15 done. 16 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: And Social Security 17 just came out with a requirement that everybody get 18 their check electronically, some way or another. And 19 they're issuing for people who don't have bank accounts, 20 they're just issuing a credit card with that amount of 21 money on it. That's it. 22 MS. REILLY: Most people are very willing to 23 There are some people who insisted on getting use EFT. a check, who said they have no mechanism -- but most 24 25 people were able to get their EFT information.

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CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Okay.

2 MS. MARCH: I was over at the Long Island 3 facility today, and I just want to thank NYCERS again 4 for the use of that facility, and just tell everybody 5 that it really is heartwarming to see the people who are б no longer -- TRS is a home. 7 They're not in their home and they're 8 functioning up to par. As I told them, and I'll repeat 9 it here. If anybody criticizes an employee of the government of the City of New York again, I would really 10 11 like to be introduced to that person, because the 12 Teachers' Retirement System staff is a perfect example 13 of continuing what they have to do under what may be not 14 the best of circumstances. 15 (Mr. Smarr entered the meeting.) 16 MS. REILLY: Let the record show that Jaime Smarr is here. 17 18 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: We want to finish the 19 update. Now on to the executive report. 20 MS. REILLY: The executive director report. 21 The next item is the next meeting. It's suggested the 22 next regular meeting of the Teachers' Retirement System 23 be held on the third Thursday of the month, January 17, 24 2013. 25 Next is the resolution, reference to

1 authorization to the Comptroller of the City of New York to invest in certain funds. 2 3 MS. MARCH: I move that we waive the reading of the resolution. 4 5 MS. ROMAIN: Second. б CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Any objections to 7 waiving the reading of the resolution? 8 Seeing no objections, it is waived. 9 And we're prepared to vote. All those in favor of the resolution? 10 11 (A chorus of "Ayes.") Any opposed? 12 13 Carried. 14 We're now on resolution item number 3. 15 MS. REILLY: Authorization for control of 16 certain tax deferred funds. 17 MS. ROMAIN: I move that we waive the 18 resolves. 19 MS. MARCH: Second. 20 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Any objection to waiving of the reading? 21 22 Seeing no objections, do I have a motion to 23 accept? 24 MR. McTIGUE: Motion. 25 MS. MARCH: Second.

1	CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: All in favor of
2	accepting the resolution say "Aye."
3	(A chorus of "Ayes.")
4	Any opposed?
5	Carried, Resolution Number 4.
6	I recommend we lay that item over, and we
7	have a meeting of the budget committee to discuss the
8	matter.
9	MS. MARCH: It never passes, because then
10	our members will be in Tier 4.
11	(Laughter.)
12	It's okay. Keep objecting.
13	CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Resolution Number 5.
14	MS. REILLY: Engagement of Rocaton as an
15	investment consultant.
16	MS. ROMAIN: Resolved.
17	MS. REILLY: "Resolved, the board approve
18	the retention of Rocaton to provide investment counsel
19	services to both the qualified pension plan and the
20	variable program for one three year term, with the right
21	to renew for one subsequent additional three year term.
22	"And be it further resolved that the chair,
23	or in his absence, the deputy executive director, or in
24	her absence, the director of investment administration,
25	is hereby authorized and directed to negotiate and

1 execute appropriate investment consulting agreements and 2 take any other action as necessary to implement this 3 resolution."

4 MS. ROMAIN: I move the resolution. 5 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Is there a second? MR. McTIGUE: Second. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Any discussion? 8 Seeing none, all in favor? (A chorus of "Ayes.") 9 Any opposed? 10 Resolution carries. 11 Resolution Number 6. 12 13 MS. REILLY: Payment of disaster recovery 14 expenses as a result of Hurricane Sandy. 15 MS. WOLPERT: I'd like to table this 16 resolution, as well. Obviously we recognize the impact of the hurricane has resulted in costs, and that we need 17 18 to address them. But I think we simply haven't had 19 enough time to review the numbers or the documentation 20 that's been provided. MS. MARCH: I would not table it. I believe 21 22 that we have a responsibility to pay to NYCERS the 23 amount of money that we owe them as a result of them 24 allowing us to use their facilities. And I don't find

25 this a very complicated issue. It's a very simple

issue. We are using their facilities, we have to
 reimburse them.

And the truth of the matter is, I don't even know why we need a resolution. I have no problem with voting for the resolution. What I believe we need is, the staff through the executive director, informing us that they are in fact reimbursing NYCERS for the use of their facility.

9 I see no reason for us to have to lay it 10 over. It is embarrassing. NYCERS has allowed us to 11 continue to function, to provide to the members and the 12 beneficiaries of this system their checks, their 13 information, et cetera. And I cannot believe that we 14 need more time to study this.

MS. ROMAIN: I agree with my colleague. I'm not asking for a modification of the budget in any way. And if a fuller explanation is needed, I'm sure it can be gotten.

But I think we should move on this and reimburse NYCERS for its expenses during the emergency and allowing TRS to continue to function.

22 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Any further23 discussion?

24 MS. WOLPERT: I understand that, and I think 25 I noted at both meetings, at the NYCERS meetings, how much the Mayor's Office and everyone else appreciates
 the things NYCERS has given the fund.

3 But we're being asked to vote on a 4 resolution that approves payment of \$130,000 for the 5 past month and \$115,000 for every month thereafter. б I received the executive director's report 7 on Tuesday afternoon. I called and asked for additional 8 information. I got a spreadsheet close to 5:00 9 yesterday, and I can't vote to authorize a payment without having more than 24 hours to look at the 10 11 documentation. 12 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: As I know, we don't 13 vote on payments that the retirement system makes to anybody. 14 15 MS. MARCH: To vendors, we don't vote on 16 that. 17 MS. WOLPERT: Being presented today? 18 MS. MARCH: I said initially in my 19 conversation, I don't think this had to be presented. I 20 think in executive director's report she could have made 21 a report that she was doing this. I don't believe that 22 the staff of this system had to request this. They are going overboard to give you information, and I don't 23 24 think that this is very difficult, complicated information to understand. 25

1 I'm re

I'm ready to vote.

2 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Thad? 3 MR. McTIGUE: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 4 To the point made by many of the trustees, I'd say for our office, the deputy executive director 5 6 provided information, engaging in a number of 7 conversations face to face, on the phone, to provide us 8 this level of detail and comfort; that the board spent 9 appropriately a number of hours talking about the degree of cooperation that NYCERS and Teachers had during this 10 11 emergency. 12 And it is our view that the purpose of the 13 resolution today is an extension of that cooperation. We are merely paying a bill. In some way NYCERS is 14 15 situated as a vendor. If Teachers had to go outside, 16 they would pay the vendor that bill. 17 Also, there's no new money. We had a 18 resolution on June 6. And we agree with Carolyn that 19 perhaps more information could be provided there. I 20 think in the spirit of cooperation we could lay that 21 over. I think the key here is there's no new money, 22 we're not asking to approve anything outside the budget approved by the board previously. 23 24 For those reasons we're prepared to vote. 25 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Any further

1 discussion?

2	MR. SMARR: We're in discussion to table the
3	motion or discussion on the actual resolution?
4	MS. MARCH: On the resolution.
5	MR. SMARR: Patricia, can I ask, and pardon
6	me if you provided this information previously. At 55
7	Water Street is the retirement system receiving a rent
8	credit over a period of time that they are unable to use
9	it?
10	MS. REILLY: Yes.
11	MR. SMARR: It's approximately the same?
12	MS. REILLY: It's a lot more.
13	(Laughter.)
14	CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Are we ready to vote?
15	All in favor?
16	(A chorus of "Ayes.")
17	Any opposed?
18	MS. WOLPERT: Opposed.
19	MR. SMARR: Opposed.
20	CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Motion carries.
21	(Discussion off the record.)
22	CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Motion passed.
23	We're up to Resolution Number 7.
24	MS. REILLY: Attendance at a conference.
25	The following resolution is for consideration and

1 possible adoption.

2	Resolved that the trustees of the Teachers'
3	Retirement System hereby approve the attendance and
4	participation of the deputy executive director and/or
5	her designee and any interested trustee at the national
6	conference on public retirement systems from January 27
7	through January 29, 2013.
8	CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Do I hear a motion?
9	MS. ROMAIN: To move the resolution.
10	CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Second?
11	MS. MARCH: Second.
12	CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Any discussion?
13	MS. ROMAIN: I want to restate this. This
14	is the legislative conference of this organization.
15	CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Thank you.
16	Any other discussion?
17	All in favor?
18	(A chorus of "Ayes.")
19	Any opposed?
20	Okay. So that passes, and we are now
21	finished with the executive director's report.
22	MS. REILLY: We're deferring the calendar
23	until we get back to 55 Water Street, but we can approve
24	the November 15 Teachers' retirement board meeting
25	minutes.

1 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Part of the calendar 2 is the minutes of our last meeting. 3 Is there a motion to approve minutes? 4 MR. SMARR: Motion. CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Discussion? 5 All in favor? 6 7 (A chorus of "Ayes.") 8 Any opposed? 9 The minutes have been approved. The rest of the calendar will be reported on 10 11 at a subsequent meeting. We're now up to other business. 12 13 Does any board member have any business? 14 Does staff have any business? 15 We're finished with other business. There's 16 nobody here from the public, so we can skip that. That 17 brings us down to the necessity for having an executive 18 session. 19 Do I hear a resolution? 20 MS. MARCH: I move we go into executive session under Public Officers Law 105 for purposes of 21 discussing sales and securities. 22 23 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Do I hear a second? 24 MS. ROMAIN: Second. 25 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Any discussion?

1 All those in favor of going into executive 2 session? 3 (A chorus of "Ayes.") 4 Any opposed? 5 We're now in executive session. MR. SMARR: Next month will be my last month 6 7 with the City of New York. After almost 17 years with 8 the City of New York I have accepted a position with the 9 National Housing Partnership. The National Housing Partnership is a very active affordable housing 10 11 developer in the Southeast. And they're opening a New 12 York office, which I'm going to take over. 13 I started my career in low income housing at 14 the Boston Housing Authority. So it is something I'm going back to. 15 16 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Does that mean in a year you will be back before the board? 17 18 (Laughter.) 19 MR. SMARR: It looks like they have enough 20 capital, but who knows. I may need to speak to the conflict of interest board. 21 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: This board, the city 22 23 side and employee side are greatly interested in what we 24 can do for low cost housing and Work Force Housing. MR. SMARR: My entire career has been at 25

1 housing. Even at the Department of Education I was 2 doing housing a little bit with schools. 3 MS. MARCH: Congratulations and good luck. 4 MS. VAN EYSDEN: Good luck. (Discussion off the record.) 5 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Can we draw up a 6 resolution for Jaime next month? 7 8 MR. GILLER: Yes. CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Do I hear a motion to 9 10 go back into regular session? 11 Are we prepared to go back into public 12 session? 13 MS. MARCH: I move we go back into public 14 session. 15 MR. SMARR: Second. 16 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Objection? We're now back in public session. 17 Do I hear a further motion? 18 19 MS. MARCH: Before I make that motion, I'd 20 like to remind everybody it's another end of another 21 year. And Patricia, would you relay to the staff 22 23 that we thank them, and I wish everybody a happy and healthy new year. 24 MS. REILLY: Thank you. You too. 25 26 CHAIRPERSON AARONSON: Is it all right to do

1	that?
