



New Law Updates Benefits

The New York State budget for 2024-2025 (known as Chapter 56 of the Laws of 2024) contains provisions that apply to TRS retirees. The effective date of Chapter 56 was April 20, 2024.

Post-Retirement Earnings

The amount of post-retirement income that retirees under age 65 may earn in New York State public employment is limited to \$35,000 per year under state law.

However, due to a legislative exemption, since April 2022, retiree earnings from public school employment in New York State do not count toward the annual earnings limit. Chapter 56 extends this exemption through June 30, 2025.

Tier VI Final Average Salary

For Tier VI members who retire on or after April 20, 2024, the calculation of Final Average Salary (FAS) will be the same calculation used for Tier IV members. This means pension benefits will be based on the highest *three* consecutive annual salaries, and a total of five years of wages will be considered to apply any exclusions.

The FAS calculation is unchanged for Tier VI members who retired before April 20, 2024. That calculation is based on the highest *five* consecutive annual salaries, and a total of nine years of wages are considered to apply any exclusions.

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Pensions Revised for Recent Union Contracts

Two recent union contracts increase retirement allowance payments for close to 2,200 retirees. First, TRS recalculated benefits for recent retirees under the 2023 United Federation of Teachers (UFT) Contract. Approximately 2,000 UFT members who retired since September 2022 were eligible for a revision, and these revisions were completed in the first quarter of 2024.

We then recalculated benefits for recent retirees under the 2023 Council of School Supervisors & Administrators (CSA) contract. About 200 CSA members who retired since January 2023 were eligible for a revision, and we expect to complete these revisions in the second quarter of 2024.

In general, after each union contract is ratified, the employer determines any retroactive salary adjustments for covered members. As soon as TRS receives the updated salary information from the employers, we then evaluate any possible effect on a member's retirement allowance. Revisions are processed as promptly as possible, and we advise members in advance of upcoming changes to their payment schedule.

When you call 1 (888) 8-NYC-TRS, before speaking to a Member Services Representative, you'll need to enter information to verify your identity (TRS Membership/Retirement Number, date of birth, last four digits of Social Security number). For added security, our Representative may ask additional verification questions. The best times to call TRS are generally afternoons later in the week. If there is a lengthy wait time, you may be offered a callback when a Representative is available.

Email

Send a general inquiry to AskTRSNYC@trs.nyc.ny.us and we'll normally reply within three business days. However, we cannot provide member-specific

information via email, and we advise you to mail a letter (or fax to (212) 918-9253) if you need to submit a personal request in writing.

Virtual Appointment

Use the link on our website's homepage to schedule a half-hour virtual appointment with a Member Services Representative. TRS will send you a confirmation email with a link you can use to join the meeting. For tips on a smooth meeting experience, search for "virtual appointment" on our website.

In-Person

No appointment is necessary to visit our offices at 55 Water Street in lower Manhattan. Note that you will need to show government-issued photo identification with a signature.

Chat

If you're logged in to the secure section of our website during business hours, you can use our live chat feature—just click the green circle icon at the bottom of your screen. When available, a Representative will ask for your TRS Membership/Retirement Number before assisting you.

Death Benefit Increase

In addition to the legislative changes described on page 1, another recent New York State law may affect death benefits payable to beneficiaries of TRS members.

The ordinary death benefit that is sometimes known as "Death Benefit #2" applies to all members, non-retired and retired, except those in Tier I. Chapter 716 of the Laws of 2023 contains changes that may result in an increase to the benefits payable to designated beneficiaries of members who die on or after July 1, 2021. Currently, members affiliated with the United Federation of Teachers are credited with 7% annually on TDA investments in the Fund. Other members' TDA investments in the Fund, and any member's QPP investments in the Fund, are currently credited with 8.25% annually. Historical rates are published on our website. For retirees and annuitants who have Fixed Return Fund investments, the guaranteed return is factored into their monthly payments. Funds that members allocate to the Fixed Return Fund are invested with the Pension Fund.



Most TRS Retirees Live in New York

TRS has retirees in all 50 states, a few U.S. territories, and 38 foreign countries. But how many would you guess still live within the five boroughs?

Out of 95,000 people receiving retirement benefits from TRS, 42% still call New York City home! Another 27% live in the Empire State, but outside of the City.

Overall, that means roughly 7 out of 10 retired TRS members have chosen to reside in New York State. And the money that they earned after a career educating the youth of New York City is going right back into the City and State economy. Thank you, retirees!



Divorce Can Affect Benefits from TRS

A Domestic Relations Order, or DRO, is a court order detailing how assets—including TRS accounts—are to be divided in a divorce.

The *TRS Guide to Domestic Relations Orders* is a valuable resource for members in this situation and their legal counsel. Some of the topics this brochure covers are:

- How QPP and TDA assets may be divided between the member and former spouse (the "Alternate Payee")
- How a DRO may affect a member's beneficiary designations and payment options

The brochure also includes a model DRO document that parties may use to create a draft DRO, and we recommend that parties submit an unsigned draft to TRS for review.



TRS Retirement Plans Are Among the Largest

E ach year, *Pensions & Investments* (www.pionline.com) ranks the largest U.S. retirement plans by asset value. In the latest survey, published in February, TRS is once again high on the list:

- \bullet Our Tax-Deferred Annuity (TDA) Program was the $2^{\rm nd}$ largest among 403(b) plans.
- \bullet The TDA Program also ranked 7^{th} among public defined-contribution plans.
- TRS' Qualified Pension Plan (QPP) is part of the combined New York City retirement plan—which was rated the 4th largest overall fund, and the 3rd largest defined-benefit plan overall.

- **July 1, 2024**: Effective date of retiree investment election changes received by May 1, 2024 (QPP changes, TDA annuitant changes) or May 31, 2024 (changes for deferred TDA accounts).
- July 2024: Mailing of EFT Quarterly Statements and posting of TDA Quarterly Statements for the second quarter of 2024.
- September 2024: New York State's 2024 Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) takes effect. This year's COLA equals 1.8%.
- October 1, 2024: Effective date of retiree investment election changes received by August 1, 2024 (QPP changes, TDA annuitant changes) or August 31, 2024 (changes for deferred TDA accounts).
- October 2024: Mailing of EFT Quarterly Statements and posting of TDA Quarterly Statements for the third quarter of 2024.
- October 31, 2024: Deadline for filing RMD elections with TRS.

Retirement payments are transmitted on the last business day of each month; check with your bank about when funds will be available in your account.

TRS offices will be closed on the official New York City holidays occurring **June 19**, **July 4**, **September 2**, and **October 14**, **2024**. On Fridays from **July 5** through **September 6**, we will close at 1:00 p.m.
